



What is Descriptive Teaching?

It is a way to teach academic vocabulary and concepts using core words, along with other high frequency words.

A student doesn't need every word academic programmed in their speech-generating device.

What is Referential Teaching?

Referential teaching often requires a specific answer to a question to tell if a student has learned a concept.

"What is the action that changes or maintains a body or object?"

Answer: Force

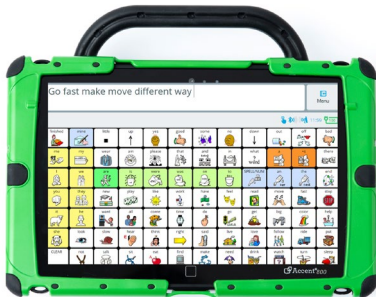

Using Descriptive Teaching

The student needs the word (e.g.: force) in their speech-generating device to answer this question. Instead, change the question:

Tell me what know about force using the words in your AAC system. You may hear: "go fast," "make move different way."

Adding New Words

Consider adding an academic word to the speech-generating device if:

- It is a content-specific word used repeatedly in school subjects.
- It represents a high interest area for the student and will be used often.
