Stage 3	Irregular past tense, some overgeneralized past-tense forms appear
	Possessive -'s
	Uncontractible copula (verb to be as main verb)
	Present tense auxiliaries appear
Stage 4	Articles (a, the)
	Regular past tense <i>-ed</i>
	Regular third person, present tense -s
Stage 5	Irregular third person (<i>does, has</i>)
	Uncontractible auxiliary
	Contractible copula
	Contractible auxiliary
	Past tense auxiliaries

Morpho-Syntactic Features of AAE (African American English)

Zero copula (or the deletion of the verb be and its variants)

Absence of part tense -ed

Absence of possessive -'s

Irregular verb form usage (e.g., a past tense verb is used in place of a past participle and vice versa)

Absence of plural -s (with nouns of measure)

Negation: use of ain't and multiple negation

Habitual (uninflected) be

Zero modal auxiliary

Two modal auxiliary verbs may be used in a single clause
