

Semantics

0-8 Months	Responds to their name, looks to common objects when named, comprehends some nouns
8-12 Months	Understands 3-50 words, understands simple commands, gestures/vocalizes to indicate wants or needs, first words emerge (to name, participate in communicative games, direct attention, indicate negation, recurrence)
12-18 Months	Receptive vocabulary of 200 words or more by 18 months, words are understood outside of routine games, points to familiar or desired objects, follows one-step commands, expressive vocabulary grows (15-50+ words), semantic roles expressed in single words, can answer 'what's that?'
18-24 Months	Understands single words for objects out of sight, listens to simple stories, looks to the appropriate place when asked a simple 'where' question, responds to choice of two, begins to understand and use concepts in, on, up, down, under, responds to some yes/no questions, expressive vocabulary of 200-300 words by 24 months
24-36 Months	Indicates/points to objects when described, answers simple wh- questions (who, what, what doing, where, some why, can you_?), understands basic concepts (in, on, off, out, under, one, many, all, big, little, together, away, same, not same), follows a series of related commands, begins to understand time concepts (wait, later), asks questions, uses concepts of up, down, in, on, under, expressive vocabulary of 300+ words
36-48 Months	Answers more complex questions (who, why, where, how, when, ifwhat, object functions, how many), understands some temporal (time) concepts (e.g. first), descriptive concepts (e.g., color, shape, size words), spatial concepts (e.g., behind, in front, around, next to), quantitative concepts (empty, a lot) and equality concepts (same, both), identifies item that is different from others, follows multi-step directions, expressive vocabulary of 1000 words
48-60 Months	Demonstrates knowledge of numbers and counting, understands spatial concepts (top, bottom, above, below), understands comparatives/superlatives (e.g., bigger), understands time concepts (yesterday, tomorrow, today, first, then, next), positional concepts, (first, middle, last), may ask for meanings of unfamiliar words
5-6 Years	Understands opposite concepts, understands <i>left/right</i> , can compare and contrast (i.e., identify how items are same and different), uses adjectives for describing, uses comparatives (e.g., <i>bigger</i>), uses yesterday, tomorrow, uses later developing prepositions (<i>through, nearest, corner, middle</i>) uses ordinal numbers (<i>first, second, third</i>)
