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#### **Tips and Tricks**


- Remember to download the Smart Chart packet for your student's language system
- Print this packet in portrait mode; change printer setting to gray scale or black if you don't want to use color ink
- Use the different section headings to organize student work and notes
- Make sure to download the other packet, titled Resources 2. Print those in landscape mode.
- Mix it up! If your AAC author wants to write about something that is not discussed in the book activities, let them. Feel free to use any of the writing templates for any of the activities; just make sure to encourage your AAC writer and help them make connections to their writing and the topic, the environment, or their lived experiences.

They serve as a central hub for each learner's reading and writing activities, enabling educators, parents, and students themselves to monitor progress, document growth, and reflect on instructional impact. They allow educators, parents, and students themselves to track progress, identify trends in students' reading preferences, and tailor future reading materials to their interests. Keep the notebooks updated with completed projects to create a comprehensive record of each student's journey. This will offer valuable insights and data for support teams to design targeted interventions. Nurture a lifelong love for reading and writing while cultivating a richer educational experience for your students using AAC.
