Instructions

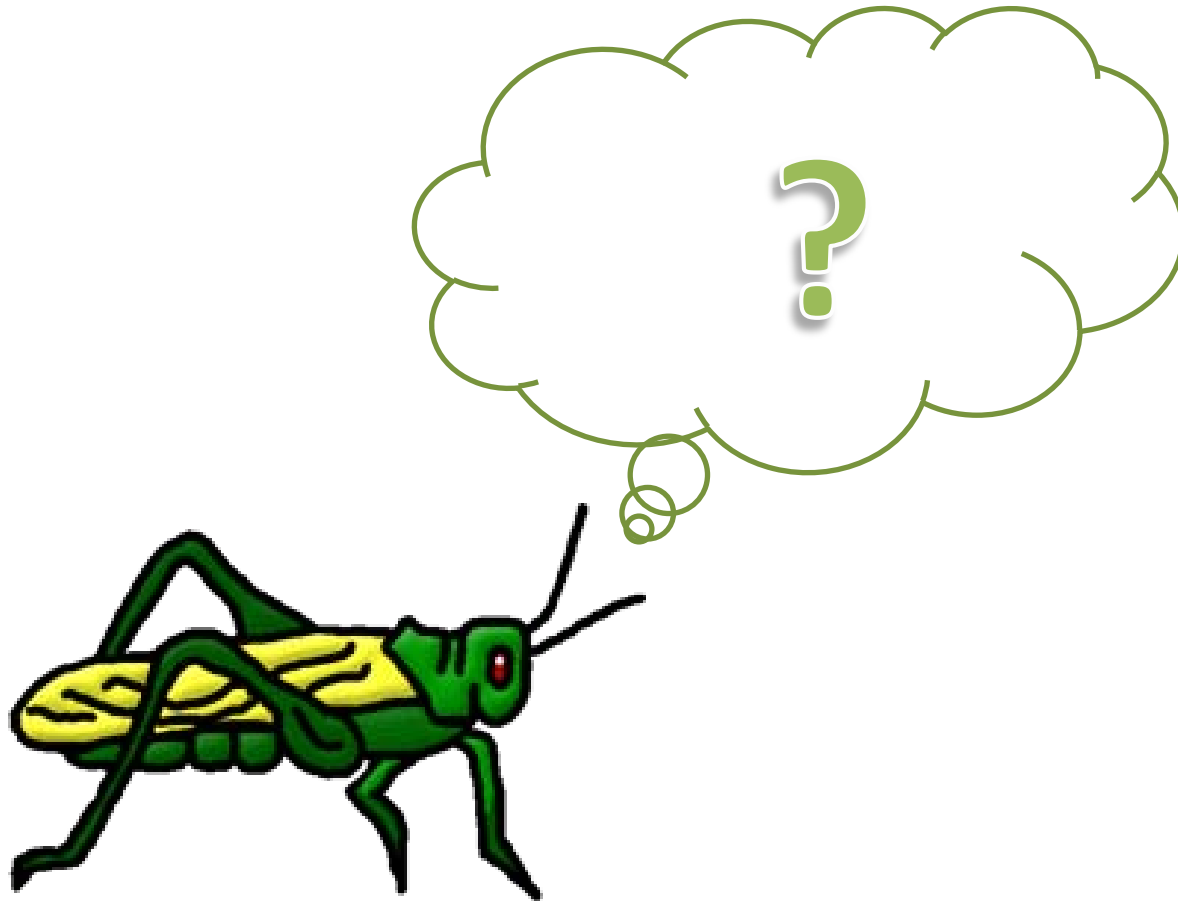
- Review the vocabulary words targeted

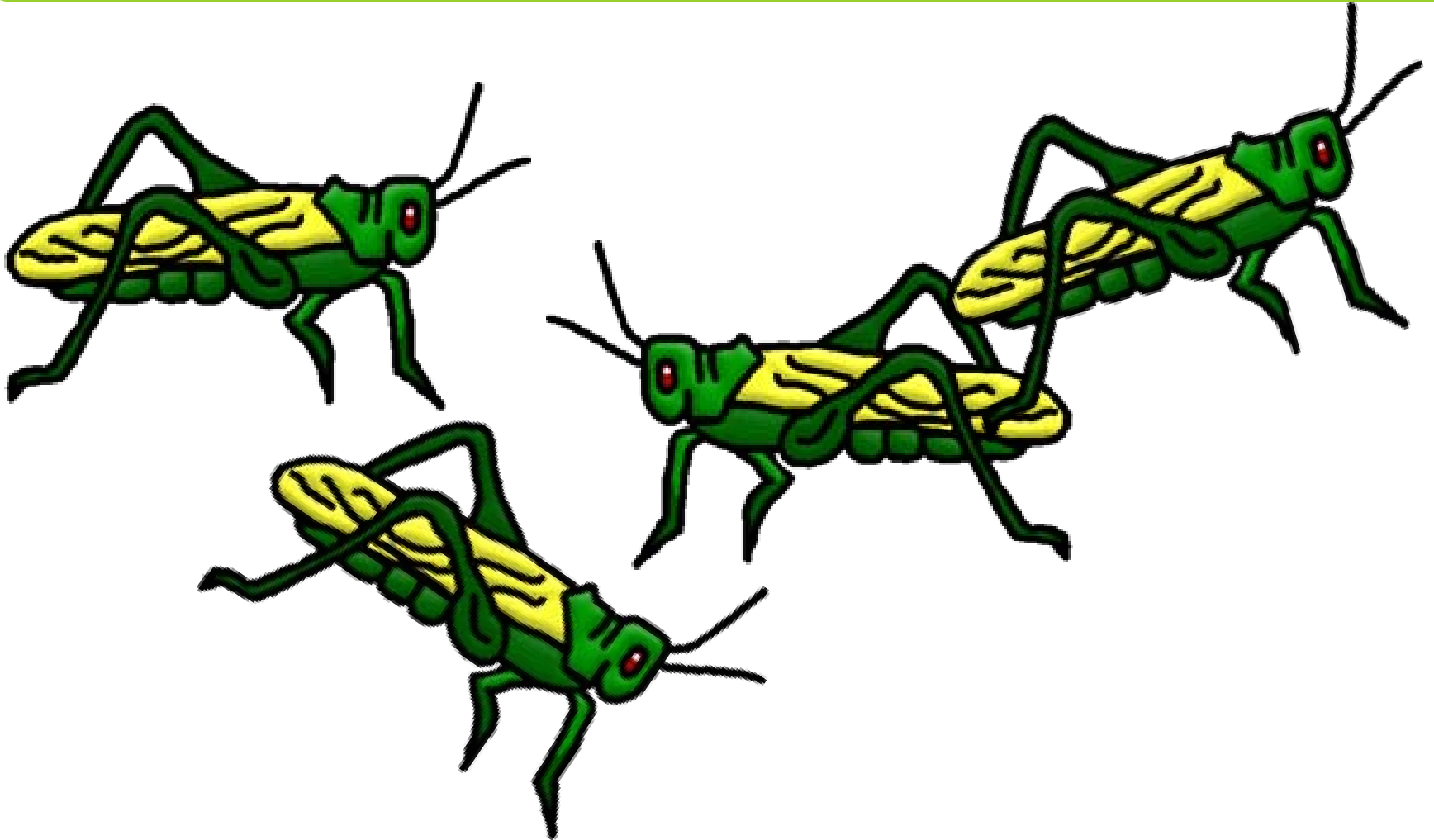

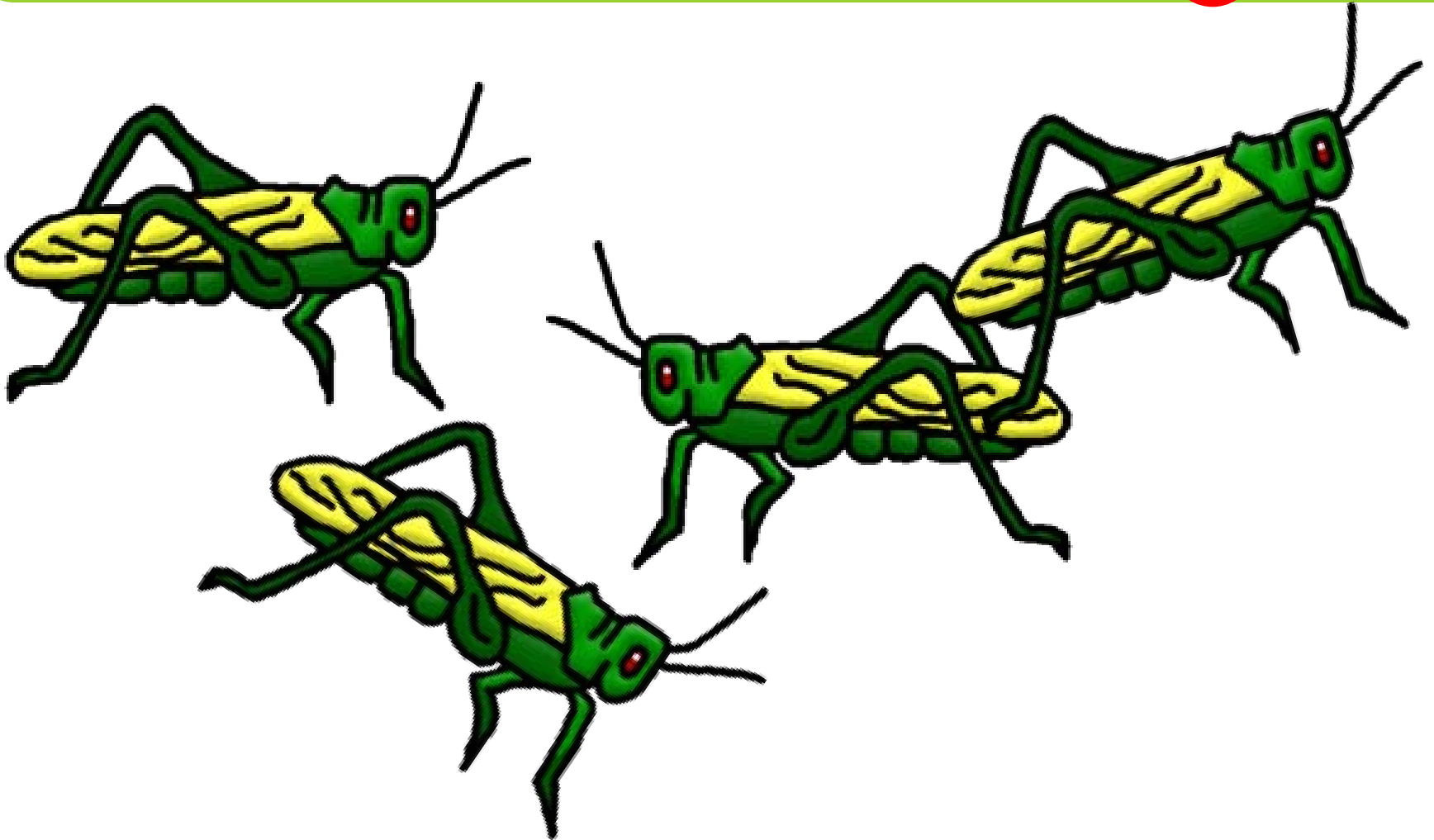

Max and his friends went back to Max's house and told his mother. He asked her if they could keep them as pets.



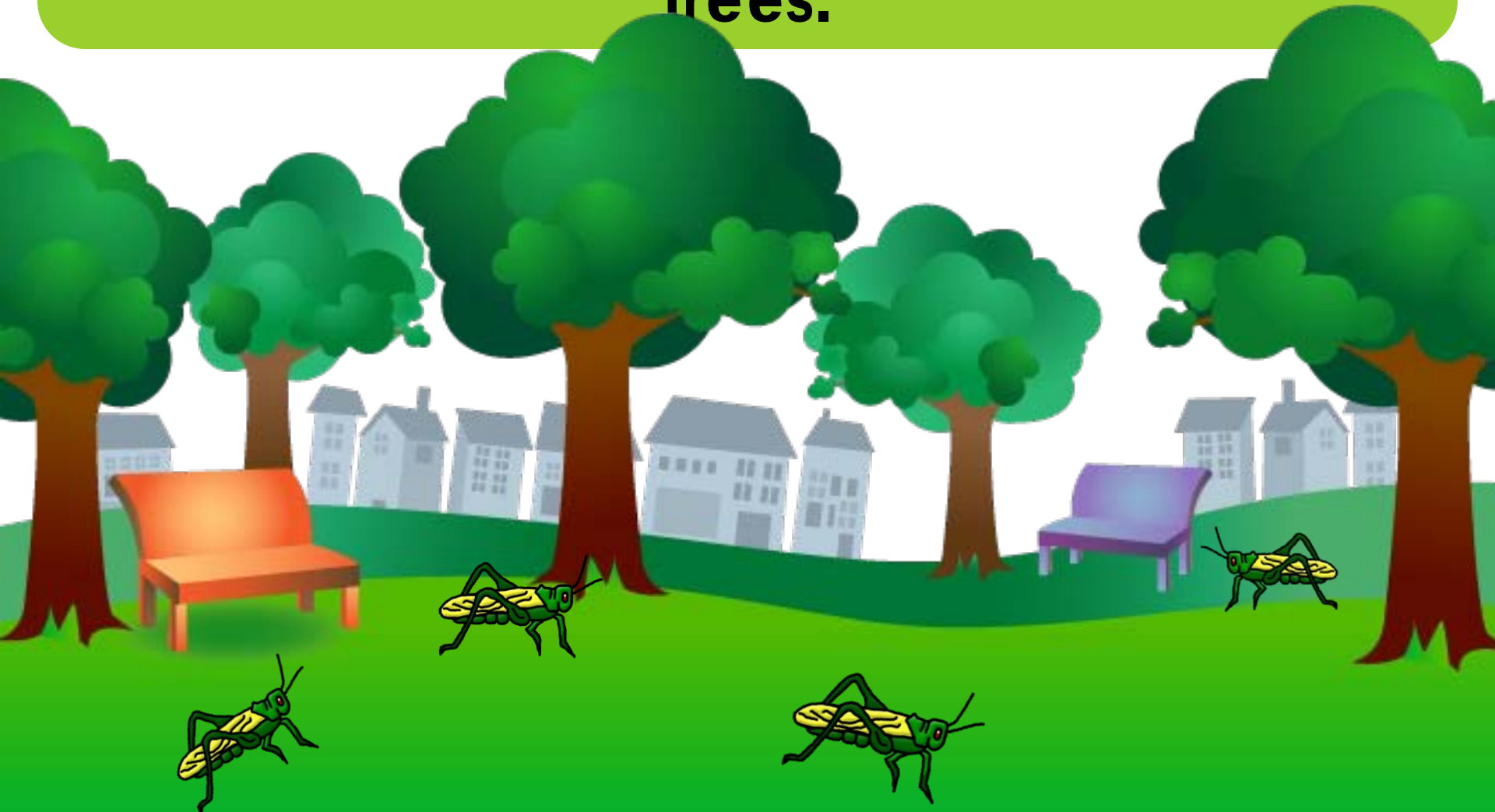

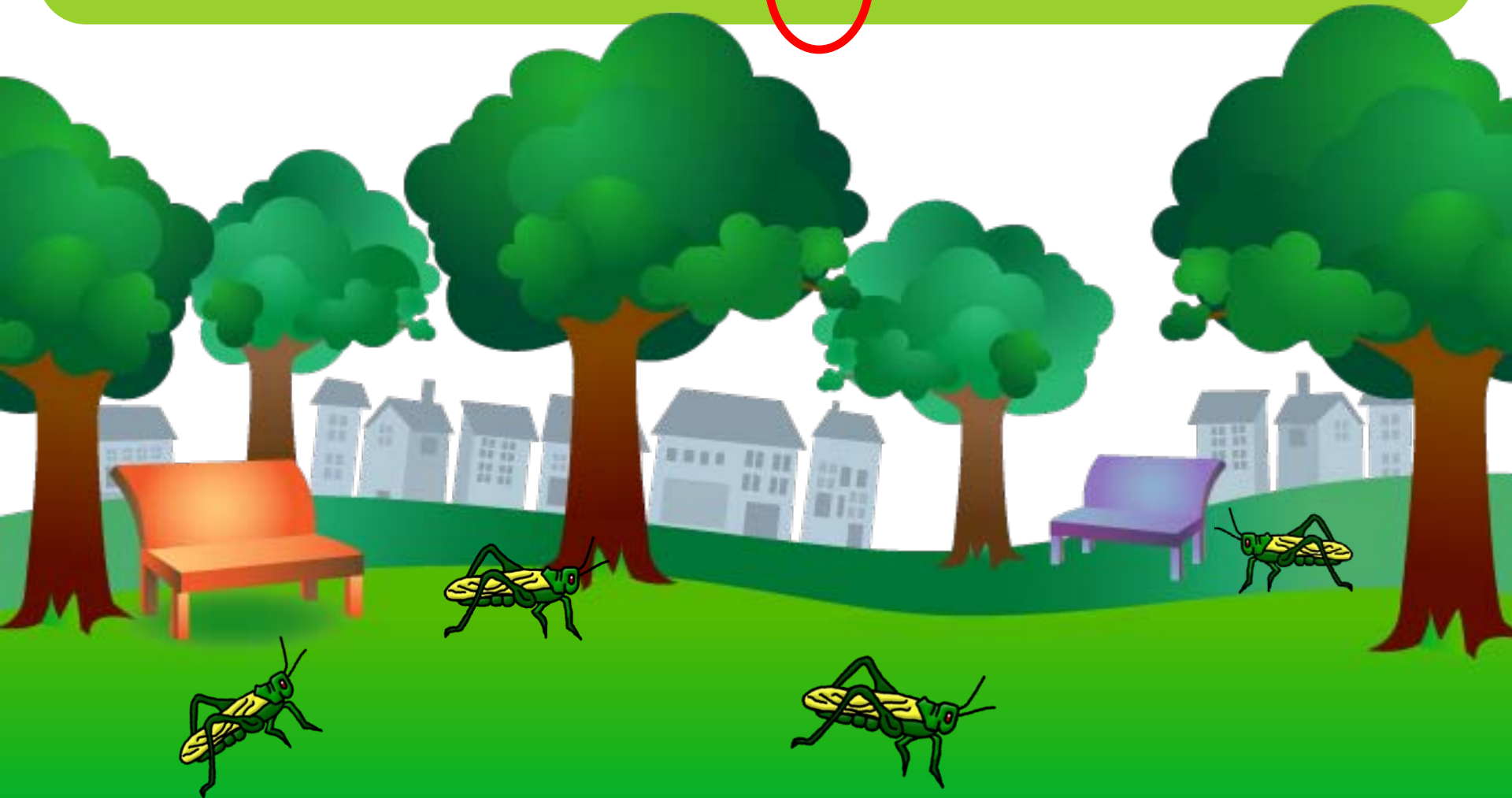

The next day, Max and his friends went back outside to see the grasshoppers again, but they were gone! They had hopped away!

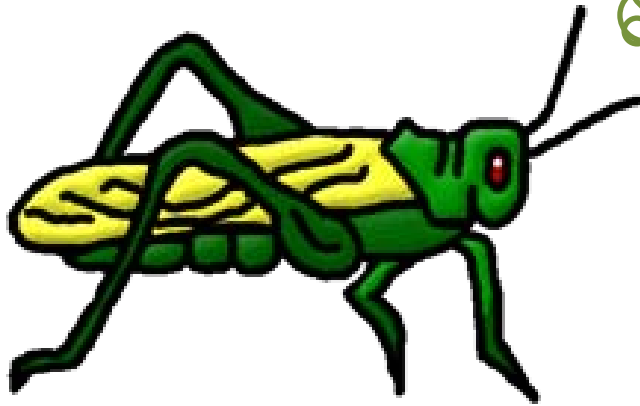

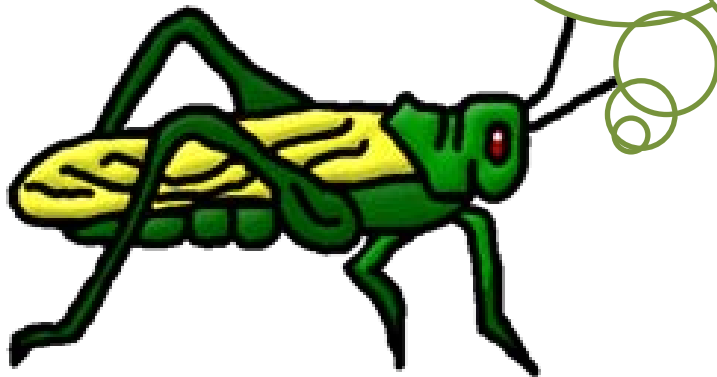
